At the Middle Georgia Center for Academic Excellence, our ultimate goal is to help students graduate from college by equipping them to be successful with meeting their specific academic needs. Through our Federal TRIO and Georgia Department of Human Services programs, we mentor over 1,400 students annually and have assisted with the college enrollment of over 2,500 students.

The Middle Georgia Center for Academic Excellence was established in 2002 by Executive Director, Samuel F Hart, Sr. After spending over thirty years in higher education, Mr. Hart created the Center to continue growing his vision for expanding college and post-secondary education opportunities for low- income and potential first-generation college students.

Upward Bound students have multiple weekly opportunities to benefit from after-school tutoring and assistance. They, also, have access to supplemental instruction, skills workshops, and standardized test preparation as well as numerous enrichment opportunities that include field trips and college tours.

UPWARD BOUND

Upward Bound students have multiple weekly opportunities to benefit from after-school tutoring and assistance. They also have access to supplemental instruction, skills workshops, and standardized test preparation. We offer numerous enrichment opportunities including field trips and college tours.



UPWARD BOUND MATH & SCIENCE

Upward Bound Math & Science students receive the same types of tutoring and activity options as Upward Bound students, but with a specific emphasis on STEM subjects. This program focuses primarily on cultivating interest and aptitude in STEM and, ultimately, helping students graduate college in a STEM-related discipline.



EDUCATIONAL TALENT SEARCH

Educational Talent Search is a more flexible program designed to meet student's specific needs and interests. Some students may require just a few tutorials during the school year, while others may need weekly help. Students also receive helpful services like college admissions assistance. Students in this program enjoy a host of workshop and field trip activities.



UPPER LEVEL THINKING

Upper Level Thinking (ULT) is the Georgia Center for Academic Excellence's state-funded program. ULT is an esteem-based, after-school tutoring program focused on raising students' critical thinking abilities. All students receive subject tutorials, supplemental assistance, help with homework, and daily physical activity.









